## Feed Reader Options

- Reader Types
  - Browser Based
    - MS IE 7+ (Win), FireFox 2.0+ (All), Safari (Mac), Pluck (Win), Sage (All), etc.
  - Online
    - Google Reader, NewsGator, etc. (www)
  - E-Mail / RSS Readers
    - Mozilla Thunderbird (All), etc.
  - Stand Alone RSS Reader Software
    - FeedReader 3 (Win), NewsLife (Mac), etc.

## What is Syndication?

- Make Content Available for to Others to Publish
  - Television Programming (Usually Re-Runs)
  - Articles or Comics in Periodicals
  - Radio Programming
  - ... & Now... The Web... RSS
    - Text Info
    - Audio Info (Podcasting)
    - Video Info (VideoCasting)
    - ...and More...

- Review RSS and Benefits
  - RSS = A standard for publishing information that can be syndicated by other websites, and subscribed to with News Reader software.
  - Built-In mechanism for getting links to your website content.
  - Very Good alternative to e-mail advertising.
  - Automatic distribution mechanism.

- Possible Content to Publish through RSS
  - Specials / Sales
  - New Product Announcements
  - Articles
  - FAQs
  - Newsletter Type Information
  - Audio (Podcasting)
  - Video (VideoCasting)

## Creating RSS Feeds





- Editing the <u>Feed</u> Fields
  - Title
  - Description
  - Link
  - Publish Date
- Has Built-In Spell Checking




- Editing the Feed <u>Item</u> Fields
  - Title
  - Description (note Raw HTML)
  - Link
  - Publish Date



- HTML Editor for Description
  - Basic Formatting
  - Red Underlined Misspelled / Not Recognized Words
  - Linking Tool
  - Symbol Tool






- Post Directly to Website
  - Post via FTP
  - Standard Login Information
  - Place in Target Directory



- Downloading Existing Feeds
  - Provide Feed URL
  - FeedForAll Downloads Feed
  - You Can Edit Existing Feed
  - Has Problems Reading Many Feeds

  - Specials
  - New Product Announcements
  - Articles
  - FAQs
- Basic CMS FREE
- The Google Bonus
- www.Blogger.com
- Recent Major Improvements





- Blogger Hosting Options
  - Blogspot.com Hosting
    - Saves You Space
    - Faster Posting
    - External Links to Your Website
    - Multiple Blogs All Linking to Your Website (Free)
    - Must Use Google Analytics for Stats
  - FTP Onto Your Website
    - More Content On Your Website



- Aggregating RSS Feeds
  - Content That You Don't Have To Write
  - Permission Easy to Get, Sometimes
     Automatic
  - Can Help With Ranking
  - More Value For Your Guests
  - Must Pick Feeds With Good Relevant Content
  - Create Custom Feeds w/ Yahoo!Pipes
    - http://pipes.yahoo.com/

- Aggregating External Feeds
  - Solution Types
    - Client-side JavaScript (Do NOT Use)
      - Fairly Simple, No Search Engine Index
    - External Aggregator Services (Ex. rss2html.com)
      - Fairly Simple, No Search Engine Index
    - Local Server Scripts (Ex. rss2html.php)
      - Your Content is Search Engine Indexed
  - Good Resource: <u>rss-specifications.com</u>
    - Select "Display RSS"

## Display RSS On Your Website

- rss2html (<a href="http://www.rss2html.com/">http://www.rss2html.com/</a>)
- PHP Script for Displaying RSS Feeds
- 3 Files
  - rss2html.php
  - sample-template.html
  - rss2html-docs.txt

## Using rss2html.php

- "Simple" Use URL, No Configuration
  - http://scripts.rss2html.com/public/rss2html.php
    - ?XMLFILE=<your-rss-feed>
    - &TEMPLATE=<your-template>
    - &MAXITEMS=<maxitems>
  - Example:
    - ?XMLFILE=http://rss.news.yahoo.com/rss/topstories
- Advanced Edit rss2html.php
  - \$XMLfilename = "sample.xml";
  - \$TEMPLATEfilename = "sample-template.html";

- Promoting Your Feed (Cont.)
  - Blog Other Peoples' Blog Articles for Trackback Links
  - May be able to Post Comments w/ Links
    - Watch for rel="nofollow".
  - Allow Other Webmaster to Aggregate Your Feed on Their Website.
  - Post Notices to PR News Websites.
